The public test will be conducted for the purpose of testing the accuracy of the tabulating equipment and programs, which will be used to tabulate the voted ballots. The Public is invited to attend.

EARLY VOTING HOURS

The City will offer early voting for nine (9) consecutive days prior to the election beginning October 26, 2024 and ending on November 3, 2024 from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. each day.

SATURDAY CLERK'S OFFICE HOURS

The City Clerk's office will be open Saturday, November 2, 2024 from 8:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m., for electors who wish to receive an absent voter ballot for the election.

ABSENT VOTER BALLOTS

Absent voter ballots for the Election will be available at the Office of the City Clerk, 260 S Parker Street, Marine City, MI 48039, Monday through Thursday, 8 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., until November 4, 2024 at 4:00 p.m. Electors who have lost their absentee ballot or not yet received their ballot in the mail may submit a written request to spoil their absent voter ballot and receive a new absent voter ballot in the clerk's office until November 4, 2024 at 4:00 p.m.

Absentee Voter and Other Changes. The passage of Proposal 3 in November of 2018 caused various changes related to the voting process. Some of the changes include:

- Citizens can register to vote by mail until 15 days before an election;
- Citizens can also register to vote in person with the Clerk's office until 8:00 P.M. on Election night.
- All registered voters can vote absentee without needing to provide a reason. Please see the Quick Link to sign up as a permanent absentee voter.
