Any Commissioner may initiate the removal process by placing the proposed removal on a Commission agenda and receiving a majority vote of the City Commission to proceed. In order to proceed, the Commission shall adopt a resolution supporting the proposed removal which identifies each basis to support the removal. If the resolution supporting removal is adopted by the Commission, by a majority

vote, the Commission shall cause the resolution to be hand delivered to the person subject to the removal process.

Any hearing on the proposed removal shall be conducted by the Commission after a minimum of 10 days after written notice is hand delivered to the person subject to the removal process.

At the hearing, the Commissioner that initiated the removal process shall set forth the factual basis to support each removal reason presented in the Resolution supporting the removal. The person subject to the removal hearing shall have the right to be present, the right to be represented, the right to present arguments, the right to present documents, the right to call witnesses and the right to respond to each removal reason as presented. A majority vote of the Commission, exclusive of any member whose removal is the subject of the hearing, shall be required for any removal.

Any person removed under this Section shall not be eligible for elected office in the City for a period of ten (10) years.
